- 7. A preferred time frame: fall, winter, or spring term -- or a combination; preferred Friday dates/ times if known
- 8. Name of coordinator for the proposed lectures
- 9. Name of department/program and department chair

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

- Lecture coordinators propose a series of lectures, and when accepted, provide lecture arrangements and coordination, including speaker contract, travel arrangements, local transportation and accommodations for the lecturer.
- OCATE provides \$1,000 per delivered lecture to the coordinating department or program. This is intended to cover coordination costs associated with the lecture, including speaker travel, accommodation, and honorarium.
- OCATE provides marketing, facilities and other administrative services for each lecture.
- Lectures are held on Fridays at either 12:30 pm (brown bag lunch) or 4:00 pm at OCATE in Beaverton. Two lectures can be scheduled on one day if the topics are diverse enough to draw distinctly different audiences.
- There are 25 available Fridays between Oct. 4, 2002 and May 16, 2003. A calendar of open dates is available and will be accessible on the web site to lecture coordinators.
- Lectures are videotaped and available as streaming video in Real Media format.
